## Background and overview

As a part of the regular five- yearly cycle of visits conducted by APAC, an accreditation assessment site visit was undertaken between 3 and 5 July 2019 at Victoria University. The Discipline of Psychology within the College of Health and Biomedicine offers psychology programs on one campus in Footscray Park.

The Assessment Team reviewed Victoria University's application for accreditation against the Accreditations Standards, using evidence obtained from the application, its appendices, VU's website, additional information provided by the applicant, and information obtained during the course of the visit.

During the visit the Assessment Team met with:

- Professor Jenny Sharples, Head of Psychology
- Professor Karen Dodd, Pro-Vice Chancellor and Dean, College of Health and Biomedicine
- The program coordinators and staff teaching in the various programs
- Nine undergraduate students,
- Four Honours students,
- Three Master of Professional Psychology students and three field supervisors
- Five Master of Applied Psychology (Clinical Psychology) students and one field supervisor
- Four Master of Applied Psychology (Community Psychology) students and two field supervisors
- Two members of the Administrative staff.

The Assessment Team toured the psychology related facilities located at Victoria University and inspected the test library and psychology clinic at MetroWest, Nicholson Street.



# Key findings

The psychology programs offered by Victoria University appear to meet most of the 2019 Accreditation Standards. Innovative teaching approaches are used, the staff appear to be enthusiastic teachers and there is a strong awareness of cultural diversity. In many instances where a criterion is not met, a major contributing factor is that the relevant criterion differs markedly from the requirements in the old Standards.
