### **Recommendations**

It is recommended that the School of Psychological Science (School):

- explores opportunities to increase content related to the applicable codes of conduct for the psychology profession (1.2)
- should consider ways to strengthen its formalised processes to ensure the systematic and robust oversight of program monitoring, review and improvement (2.1).

The Assessment Team strongly recommends that the School considers holding more frequent Course Advisory Committee (CAC) meetings to provide feedback and collect critical input from relevant key stakeholders, particularly while the program is under development and in its first iteration of delivery (2.3).

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
