

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Recommendations

The assessment team offers the following recommendations for continuous improvement:

- provide clearer wording on the website to avoid confusion with APAC accreditation and ACAP self-accrediting authority status (criterion 4.3).
- explore strategies to mitigate any potential risks to the stability of the staffing profile, and formally recognise the contributions made by continuing academic staff to support the viability of the programs (criterion 2.5).

- establishing the Aspiring Scholars program to encourage and support the early career academics in research and scholarship.
