

APAC Board Communiqué

November 2025

The APAC Board met on **24 November 2025**. Our post-Board communique is designed to give stakeholders a greater insight into the workings of APAC Board meetings.

Accreditation Business

The Board noted that the Assessment Accreditation Committee (AAC) and the CEO had made determinations under powers delegated to them by the Board. All determinations are reported to the Psychology Board of Australia (PsyBA), which will then decide whether to approve each program for the purpose of registration.

Other Business

The Board also reviewed the minutes and outcomes from the Stakeholder Reference Group which will be integrated into the Board Strategy Workshop scheduled for March 2026.

The Board approved:

- Accreditation function key performance indicators and targets for 2026.
- The election of office bearers for 2026 with Associate Professor John Dunn appointed as Chair, Professor Mary Katsiktis appointed as Deputy Chair and Mr Mark Eldridge appointed as Treasurer; and
- The reappointment of Dr. Erin O'Connor to the Board's Accreditation Assessment Committee and the appointment of a further nine assessors all effective from 1 January 2026.
- The appointment of a consultant to conduct a Board Performance Review for reporting in March 2026.

The Board also endorsed the draft budget for the financial year ending 30 June 2027 for consultation with the Psychology Board of Australia, as well as the final project reports on the Risk-Based Decision-making Framework and Operational Efficiencies projects.

The next APAC Board meeting will take place on Friday 27 February 2026.
